### MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 8th OCTOBER 2008

Members present: B Crossdale, M Shepherd and C Wilson.

The Clerk, Mrs L Walker was absent. The Chair requested a volunteer to take the minutes of the meeting. None were forthcoming and so the Chair took the minutes.

#### 1 Apologies

Apologies were received from J Adams and M Williams

#### 2 Minutes of the last meeting

#### 3 Matters arising from the minutes

With reference to Item 12, BC read out a letter of apology from JA.

MS asked about the proposed parish boundary change at Hanover Green. BC said that Selby DC was still consulting residents and Womersley PC.

#### 4 Public Question Time

Mr Chisem asked for an update on the bus situation. BC told him that NYCC had asked bus companies for prices but they were too expensive. NYCC had therefore asked for prices from taxi companies to run a limited service. There was a strong possibility that a subsidised bus service, using a large taxi, would be running soon. It would run at set times, charge bus rates and accept passes. The resident asked for a breakdown of the prices that were too expensive.

Mrs Senior said she had concerns about the bonfire that was advertised in The Cridling News. BC said that it was not an official parish bonfire and was inserted into the newsletter at the request of a resident who was inviting all residents to a bonfire party at her house, with the bonfire being lit on the allotments. Mrs Senior said that it was an official parish bonfire as it states so in the parish newsletter. BC told her that it had nothing to do with the Parish Council or the Village Hall Committee or any other organisation in the village. Mrs Senior insisted it was minuted that she said it was an official bonfire as the public was invited in the newsletter and she was concerned about accidents and fireworks being lit near her horses.

#### 5 Reports from various meetings

BC reported he had attended a meeting of the Selby Area Committee where the bus service in Cridling Stubbs had been discussed.

### 8 Wind Farm update

BC reported that Your Energy was still compiling the Environmental Impact Assessment. He said that Selby DC had been allocated a certain amount of green energy production in the area and one wind farm would produce more than this quota.

### 9 Playground update

BC reported that the Cridling Stubbs Educational Charity had awarded £10,000 towards the cost of £40,000. A decision on an application submitted to Epac had been deferred until December because of a shortage of funds and an application was being submitted to the Community Spaces Fund shortly.

### 10 Grass Cutting

BC reported that the Cridling Stubbs Community Fund had awarded the parish council £4,692.12 towards the project to purchase a grass mower, strimmer, benches and planters. The mower and strimmer had been purchased and the large grasses area cut several times. He thanked residents, especially CW for their hard work. Residents would be consulted on the scheme and the benches and planters ordered soon.

### 11 Planning Application – Cridling Stubbs Village Hall

As four members of the parish council were also members of the Village Hall Committee, this was not discussed.

The hedges of households backing onto the bypass need cutting to improve the visibility of drivers turning left onto the bypass.

Vehicles are speeding through the village. Young people of the youth club to be asked to draw posters asking drivers to slow down.
