CRIDLING STUBBS PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the parish council meeting held on the 14 October 2009

1 Members present

B Crossdale, C Wilson and G Byram

2 To accept apologies

Apologies accepted from SL on holiday

3 Co-option of new parish councillor

Declaration of office form signed by Mr G Byram. BC welcomed GB to the parish council.

4 To remind councillors to declare any interest

CW declared a prejudicial and personal interest on item 13 on the agenda as he lives opposite the proposed development.

5 Minutes of the meeting of 9 September 2009

The signing of the minutes was deferred until November 2009 meeting as GB was not a councillor at the September meeting therefore as SL is absent the meeting was not quorate for this item.

6 Matters arising from the minutes of 9 September 2009

Item 16 of the minutes reports from various meetings BC now has plans for flood plains in the area.

7 Planning application from Darrington Quarries re- Leachate Treatment Tanks.

D Molland and S Farrar from WRG gave a presentation.

BC asked what the difference was between Darrington Quarries and WRG and was told that they are both owned by FCC.

BC adjourned the meeting for 10 minutes at 7.10pm. The meeting was re-opened at 7.30pm. BC asked that quite a few years ago Darrington Quarries paid £5,000 a year to the Cridling Stubbs Community Fund. It was asked if WRG would make a similar donation to the Community Fund. Mr Molland said that he would look into this and let the parish council know as soon as possible.

A resident asked about a recent press release proposed extension at Darrington Quarries. He showed concern that stone would be moved by the same route as now. This would mean that the quarry would be running for approximately another 18 years+.

The resident also was concerned that when the Highways Agency start to make the new A1 all traffic might have to come through Cridling Stubbs down the by pass. GI asked that if they wanted to change the route they would need permission. The resident said that he thought that a haul road would be better.

A resident asked D Molland and S Farrar from WRG if they would live near a treatment site, they replied they couldn't see why not.

He also asked if this would de-value the housing. They thought not, as the site is quite a way from the village. BC said that de-valuation was not a planning consideration.

8 Correspondence

A letter from SDC has been received about the renaming of the JAG group to CEF. The next meeting of the CEF will be held at Chapel Haddlesey church hall on the 22 October 2009 6.30pm for 7.00pm.

9 Womersley Burial Board

16 Cars parked on the footpath and buses mounting the pavement

A resident told the meeting that buses are regularly having to mount the pavement to get through the village, particularly at the narrow part of the road, where the footpath is wider. It was decided to ask PC Morton to have a word with Arriva. Regarding the parking on the footpath it was decided to ask North Yorkshire Police to put a leaflet on the offending cars warning of impending action being taken by them.

It was also brought up about some residents leaving their bins out or bringing them out too early and obstructing the footpath. It was decided to contact SDC to see if they have any by laws about putting bins out too early and leaving them out. This item to be placed in the newsletter.

17 Vegetation overhanging the footpath

It was decided to ask NYCC to deal with this.

18 Reports from various meetings

BC attended the CEF pre- meeting on 13 October 2009 at Chapel Haddlesey.

BC informed the meeting that the police volunteers at Eggborough police station were now able to do the ring master service. It was decided that the Neighbourhood Watch scheme needs updating. A meeting about the neighbourhood watch scheme will be held in the village hall on 18 November 2009 at 7.00pm. A flyer to be circulated informing the residents about this.

BC and LW attended a meeting at SDC on 13 October 2009 regarding funding for office equipment to enable parish councils to access the Planning Portal at SDC. The parish councils had been told that this meeting was about funding and that funding was in place for this, but on attending the meeting it was found not to be the case and that individual parish councils had to apply to the standard Awards for All for funding.
